St. Benedica was a
Christian convert from a
large Jewish family in
Poland. She became a nun
in the Carmel Order and
given the political
situation in Germany at
the time she was moved to
a convent in Holland.

When the Nazis invaded Holland she, along with her sister, was arrested and sent to Auschwitz where she died in 1942.

St. Maximilian also found himself at Auschwitz. Also from Poland he was ordained Priest in 1918 and set about promoting dedication to Our Lady in that country. He founded monasteries in Japan and India and when war came to Poland he staid to open

a hospital. He was arrested because he would not surrender to the German authorities and their ideals.

He ultimately gave his life in the place of a Jewish man with a family. He died a slow painful death in place of another.
