Gospel Matthew 20:1-16

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'

THE NICENE CREED (SAID)

Beloved in Christ, we now move to the collation of your Vicar designate.

THE DECLARATION AND THE OATHS

The Bishop says

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the Catholic Creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies - the Thirty Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer, and the ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care.

THE DECLARATION OF ASSENT

Fr. Matthew makes the Declaration of Assent

I, Matthew James Cashmore, do so affirm and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the holy scriptures and set forth in the Catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness, and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

Holding the New Testament in the right hand he then faces the congregation for the Oath of Allegiance

THE OATH OF ALLEGIANCE

I, Matthew James Cashmore, swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Charles III, his heirs and successors, according to law: So help me God.

THE OATH OF CANONICAL OBEDIENCE

I, Matthew James Cashmore, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of London and the Suffragan Bishop of Fulham and their respective successors, in all things lawful and honest: So help me God.

THE COLLATION

The Bishop reads the legal document and delivers it to Fr. Matthew (who holds the seal with both hands) saying these words

Receive the Cure of Souls which is both yours and mine; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Fr. Matthew replies

Amen.

The Bishop blesses the Parish Priest in appropriate words

THE INSTALLATION

The Bishop delivers the Mandate of Induction to the Archdeacon, saying:

Now that we have duly and canonically collated our well-beloved in Christ, Matthew James Cashmore, into the cure of souls of this living, we hereby empower and require you, Archdeacon, to induct him into the real, actual and corporeal possession of this church and benefice.

The procession goes to the door of the Church. The Archdeacon places Fr Matthew's hand upon the handle of the door, saying

By virtue of this Mandate, I do induct you into the real, actual and corporal possession of this church and benefice.

Fr Matthew tolls the bell to signify his taking possession of the Parish Church. The procession returns to the chancel, where the Archdeacon, taking Fr Matthew by the hand, places him in his stall and says:

The Lord himself is your keeper, the Lord is your defence upon your right hand. The Lord preserve you from all evil; it is even he that shall keep your soul. The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in, from this time forth and for evermore. Amen.

The Bishop presents Fr Matthew to the congregation, saying:

Having duly and legally collated and inducted Fr Matthew into the cure of souls of this parish I now present him to you as your vicar. May he be richly blessed in the ministry now entrusted to him.

The new vicar may (without speeches) be welcomed by the Churchwardens, Area Dean, representatives from other Christian communities, and other local representatives.

THE PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

The Bishop introduces the prayers

Brothers and sisters, as we now make our prayer for our community and for the world, let us all pray to Christ the Lord, not only for ourselves and our own needs, but for the entire people of the world.

...Merciful Father, accept these prayers, For the sake of your Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen

The Bishop ends the prayers

Incline your merciful ear to our prayers, we ask, O Lord, and listen in kindness to the supplications of those who call on you. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

There is now an opportunity for gifts to be brought forward as the altar is prepared

You are indeed Holy, O Lord, the fount of all holiness. Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, so that they may become for us

the Body and H Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice and, once more giving thanks, he gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this in memory of me.

The mystery of faith.

We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection, we offer you, Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of salvation, giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you. Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.

Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world,


and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Frances our Pope, Justin our Archbishop, Jonathan our Bishop and all the clergy.
